What is Global Youth Day?

Global Youth Day is a special special day set aside for Adventist Youth around the world to go out into their communities and be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Global Youth Day is happening 20th March 2021 - and we want your youth group to be part of it!

Your challenge this year is to Love Thy Neighbour! This is known as one of the golden rules in the bible, it means to care for those around you, to show mercy to others (Luke 10).

So what does this look like? Keep reading - in this booklet we hope to inspire and guide your youth group on how to make a practical difference in your community this Global Youth Day!

What Can We Do?

Absolutely everyone can do something to help others, but it's important to be guided by what your community needs and what capacity your local church has.

You may already have some great ideas on your mind, before charging ahead, take some time to sit down with your youth group and consider some important questions.

What does my community need?

Consider who is in your local community and what their real needs are, you can ask your community for feedback, or search on community forums (Facebook groups) to see if there is a specific need in your community.

What services are currently available?

Is there an organisation catering to these specific needs? Will our service project displace other community-based organisations? Are there other organisations you can partner with to make your impact bigger.

What capacity does your church have?

Think about your youth group, use your strengths and skills. For example, if you're thinking about running a soup kitchen, think about the cost, the cooking skills needed, the space, etc.

What opportunities do you have beyond Global Youth Day?

Are there other ways you help those your serving? Consider what your church offers for the community and ways you could invite and connect with the person you're serving beyond today. Do you have a playgroup you can invite mothers to? Is there a special upcoming church service people would be interested in attending.

Whatever exciting ideas you have for serving your community, know that your service can make a real and lasting impact in the lives of those you serve.

Find 10 people or families in your local community and provide food hampers or grocery gift cards. Gift cards can go a long way in giving a family choice for what items they are most in need of.

Staying Safe, Legal & Fun

However you choose to serve your community, we want to ensure your group and those you serve are safe. Before starting your service project, read through our guidelines below.

Working with Children

If you are volunteering alongside or serving anyone below the age of 16, it is important to have adult supervision as well as parent or guardian permission. If taking photos or videos of children, seek permission from parents prior to doing so.

Any volunteers working with children should have the relevant safety checks to ensure the safety of all involved. Check out AdSafe (adsafe.org.au) to learn more about how this can be done.

Licenses

If you're planning on hosting an event in public, it is important that you follow the law and obtain any licenses required. Visit your local council website for more information on how to apply.

Food

Make sure you are hygenic when working with food. Make sure any food you distribute is safe to eat.

First Aid

If you're planning to host an event, ensure you have the appropriate first aid equipment on hand and take appropriate caution to avoid harm or injury.

Risk Assessment

To ensure you have done all you can to keep your youth group, any volunteers, and all those you plan on service safe, we encourage you to conduct a risk assessment. This involves looking at all potential risks, measuring the likelihood of risks occuring and the severity of consequence. Through doing so you will be aware of the different risks and can take the appropriate actions to avoid risks identified.

Stand Out!
