



Faausi is a traditional Samoan sweet dish made out of Taro, flour and coconut cream.

The initiative was led by the youth.

The purpose was to work together, inter-generationally by making a traditional Samoan dish which would be sold to raise funds which would go towards meeting youth needs throughout the year.





This had mentored our young people on planning, budgeting and financial accountability.

It was also a space of cultivating the art of story-telling between generations and unearthing the principle of sacrifice and hard work that underlies our spirituality, migration culture and vision.


