Each scene were acted out by 16 Samoan Youth groups from around New Zealand.














REACHING OUT TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

An inspirational and empowering story from Pr William who shared the struggles and lessons of resilience from his own upbringing.



It was an evening full of live music, spoken word and performing arts from influential young people in the community to inspire participants.





YOUTH CAMP AT HUNUA FALLS

parcel to take to home.



The initiative was led by the youth.


BACKYARD BLITZ

MSD identified four families who needed assistance with clearing rubbish, inorganic rubbish and backyard cleaning due to health and safety risks.








































ADVENTURERS

We've had non-SDA baptised teachers and children from non-SDA families participate in Adventurers. They are with us from induction right through to investiture and returning for another year of fun.




